Humara Bachpan Trust (HBT) is a not-for profit organization founded by Dharitri Patnaik, advocating for safe and healthy living conditions with improved socioeconomic status of communities living in poverty. It is led by children, youth and women who identify the issues, prioritize them and propose solutions to address those issues before the appropriate authorities. The focus of our work is creating an enabling built environment, publicecivic engagements, community participation in urban and rural governance and empowerment through enterprise and entrepreneurship.

MISSION

Eradicate the barriers of poverty, marginalisation and discrimination and empower communities to lead a life with dignity and better standard of living.

VISION

To create a society that fosters active citizenry among people, especially children, youth and women living in poverty.

CHILD PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT

Children cannot become empowered change agents to improve their own lives and that of their families and communities if they are not safeguarded from abuse, discrimination and harm of any kind, be it physical, sexual, emotional, or neglect. HBT therefore works towards creating a space where children feel free and are able to speak about abuse, are free from abusers and are empowered to become actors in their own protection without further discrimination or shame.

HBT is involved in various measures to enhance the access to quality education and skill development among marginalized sections of the society.

ACTION AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE



Poorer women and girls are likely to get more abused and be the victims of violence due to various reasons like inequitable access to resources, unemployment and discrimination. HBT believes that prevention should start early in life and thus educating and working with young boys and girls and promoting respectful relationships and gender equality can be the best means to prevent and eradicate gender-based discrimination and violence. HBT has been engaged in various interventions with its commitment towards the right to a life free from violence for women and girls.

SAMBHAVI- WOMEN EMPOWERMENT WITH ENTERPRISE AND EMPLOYABILITY

Women Empowerment is the major thematic area of intervention of HBT. In order to facilitate women to break this cycle of poverty and to achieve gender equality by empowering women and girls (SDG-5), HBT has various interventions such as life skills training, awareness campaigns and employability skills training, enterprise development support and job placements, etc.






RURAL DEVELOPMENT







ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE


Climate Change, a global challenge is one of the focus areas of work of Hamara Bachpan Trust. Aligned to the sustainable development goals of 'Climate Change' (SDG 13), HBT has been advocating for 'Clean & Green Environment' and is committed to safeguarding the environment.













DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

Disaster Response is HBT's one among the core area of intervention. HBT considers disaster preparedness and response as a critical aspect of its organisational mandate and has a 'Disaster Preparedness and Response Strategy' in place. At HBT, we recognise the importance of supporting people living in poverty to rebuild their lives through sustainable initiatives that promote lasting change. In recent times, two major disasters have affected Odisha-Cyclone Fani and COVID-19 pandemic.

FIGHT AGAINST COVID - 19

Households covered for spreading awareness, along with 68816 thermal scannings and 48600 oximeter readings

Clients were provided psychosocial counselling support, including patients and COVID Warriors

people were vaccinated in Bhubaneswar, Malanpur, Sundargarh, Sambalpur and Satpada

Families provided dry ration support in 15 districts of Odisha

COVID-19 safety kit distributed to pregnant women, elderly people, persons with disability, safai karamchari and widows

HBT'S RESPONSE TO CYCLONE FANI

750 Households supported with relief in form of food and drinking water

Women and 700 children supported in 23 coastal communities of Puri through temporary shelter homes called "Sambhavi Gruha"

Anganwadi centres were surveyed to assess the damages made to it by the cyclone and the necessary repairs were reported to district administration

Volunteers trained on community based psychosocial care in disaster management







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
